named him "Smokey." Boy and dog were inseparable.



I won't repeat all the information in that article, but I would like to once again urge everyone who receives this Newsletter to consider forwarding an item to the Savannah Reunion Silent Auction. Your contribution will be welcomed whether you attend the Reunion or not.

The Nashville Silent Auction provided over 70 items for attendees to bid on, which resulted in more than \$3100 brought into the VLOA treasury! While the Association needs the annual dues from members, the combination of the Silent Auction and the 50-50 drawing are the two major sources of income for your treasury.

The treasury pays for the 4X per year Newsletter, which is not cheap. It pays for maintenance and upgrades to our fantastic VLOA website. It pays our IRS filing fees so that we can maintain our tax exempt status. The treasury supports the extras and incidentals at the Reunions, such as signage, hospitality room refreshments, printing costs, recognition awards, caps and other attendee favors.

So, we depend on the generosity of our members to support the Silent Auction by contributing items that will bring bids from the Reunion attendees. The only criteria for donated items for the Silent Auction is that the item be relevant to our attendees (i.e. something that YOU would like to take home with YOU) and that it have a quality that will tend to create a bidding war between attendees for the right to WIN THE BID-DING for that item! 



LAST FLIGHT OF TWO ORIGINAL OUTLAWS



DALE E. SHERROD

December 17, 1934—January 12, 2012

Dale Sherrod, an original Outlaw has left our ranks. Dale passed away after fighting a long and courageous battle with cancer and COPD. He was laid to rest at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery with accorded full military honors.

Dale is survived by his wife of fifty-two years, Dian; daughter Angela Sherrod Tipton and two granddaughters, Georgia 9 and Anna Beth 7; and his brother William Sherrod. He was predeceased by his parents, four brothers and three sisters.

He excelled in high school football earning an athletic scholarship to play football at Oklahoma University under Coach Bud Wilkerson. He entered the U.S. Army shortly after graduating from college and married his high school sweetheart, Dian.

During his retirement years, after serving twenty-three years, Dale and Dian enjoyed traveling together throughout the world. VLOA remembers Dale from the first Branson 2000 Reunion as stepping forward and volunteering to host, together with his wife Dian the second VLOA Reunion San Antonio 2002 that was such a great success.

The words of a close friend pay poignant tribute to Dale: "Dale was a man's man and certainly a fighter. He fought to improve himself as a young man, fought for his country, and for his health and life at the end of his life. He will be missed."

HAROLD "JACK" EARWOOD, JR.

August 14, 1933—January 21, 2012

Jack Earwood, an original Outlaw was the second to leave our ranks in January 2012. Jack passed away after years of battling multiple medical problems, including heart disease. He was laid to rest with full military honors

in the Cheatham Hill Park Cemetery, Marietta, GA.

Jack is survived by his son, John and his wife Sherry, and two grand-daughters, Allison Anne and Rachel Dean; daughters Kelly Lea and Crystal Anne, her husband William and a grandson Jack Henry and granddaughter Alice Edan. Jack's wife, Alice Dean preceded him in death in 1996.

He served his country in the U.S. Army for twenty seven years and earned his Bachelor and Master's Degrees before retiring. After retirement,

Jack spent another twelve years in U.S. Civil Service. Jack was an avid motorcyclist and runner. participating in the Peachtree Road Race ten times, and a ham radio operator. When calling him phone, you were apt to receive a Morse Coded message from his answering machine. He enjoyed animals; his favorite, Turk a cat.

Jack participate in the very first mini-union of Outlaws in 1998 in Branson, MO., attended by nine other Outlaws and their wives. This group formed the first steering committee for the organization and planning from Branson 2000. Jack met again with the same group and others in Pigeon Forge, TN in 1999 and there participated in the final planning and approval for Branson 2000. Unfortunately, due to medical problems, Jack was unable to attend any of the VLOA future reunions.

VINH LONG AND THE OUTLAWS:

A NEVER-ENDING STORY

It is always fascinating how, after nearly half-a-century of being away from Vinh Long, away from the days of the original Outlaws, away from both the good and unpleasant experiences which we left behind so many years ago, that interesting anecdotes about those years continue to surface. I thought you might be interested in a recent occurrence that I have become involved with.

Several months ago, Jim Grandstaff, who monitors our website Guestbook pages for items that need a response, sent me an email. Jim suggested I follow up on an entry from someone asking where he could get an Outlaw patch. Without paying attention to the email address source, I responded that, yes, I had several generic Outlaw patches and, if he was interested, they were \$5.00 each.

His answer came back to me quickly saying he was, rather, looking for an "original" 62d patch, one which would have been worn in Viet Nam. Then I noticed that he was writing me from Denmark! His name is Anders Strand-Holm and he is an avid collector of military memorabilia.

Thus began an interesting back-and-forth dialogue about the Outlaws. Turns out he had seen an Outlaw patch on eBay, bid on it, but didn't get it because the bidding closed before he could get his last bid recorded. Somehow he located our Outlaw website and inquired about a patch. And, thus began a continuing two-way dialogue that has become more interesting each week. Anders has set up an Outlaw memorabilia corner in his home and has a growing number of genuine items. I mailed him an Outlaw cap as well as a current patch, however, he continues to search eBay for original patches and other Outlaw memorabilia.

Anders is 55 years old, lives near Copenhagen and works in an Information Technology company. His father was a Danish-loyalist resistance fighter during WWII and, after the war, served as an officer in the post-war Danish Army. The father ultimately became a Deputy Commander in the National Defense Guard. Anders himself has served as an NCO in the Danish National Defense Guard in the 70's and 80's.

When I mentioned that our 2014 reunion will commemorate the 50th Anniversary of our Viet Nam service, he indicated that he and his wife would very much like to attend as guests and visit with the people of the Outlaws! He has even applied for Associate membership in the VLOA!

Who could have guessed that our little group, the Outlaws, would become an item of international fascination and interest to a Dane who was a very young boy at the time of our Viet Nam tour.

Yes, our Vinh Long tour continues to come back to us in so many ways. The best way, however, to keep alive the bonds we formed so many years ago, is through this great organization we call the Vinh Long Outlaws Association!

Veterans' Administration Burial Benefits

For Burial in a National Cemetery

Burial benefits available include a gravesite in any of our 131 national cemeteries with available space, opening and closing of the grave, perpetual care, a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag, and a Presidential Memorial Certificate, at no cost to the family. Some Veterans may also be eligible for Burial Allowances. Cremated remains are buried or inurned in national cemeteries in the same manner and with the same honors as casketed remains. Burial benefits available for spouses and dependents buried in a national cemetery include burial with the Veteran, perpetual care, and the spouse or dependents name and date of birth and death will be inscribed on the Veteran's headstone, at no cost to the family. Eligible spouses and dependents may be buried, even if they predecease the Veteran. Requests for burial in a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) national cemetery cannot be made via the Internet. The VA does not make funeral arrangements or perform cremations. Families should make these arrangements with a funeral provider or cremation office. Any item or service obtained from a funeral home or cremation office will be at the family's expense.

Preparing in Advance

Gravesites in Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) national cemeteries cannot be reserved in advance. You should advise your family of your wishes and where your discharge papers are kept. These papers are very important in establishing your eligibility. You may wish to make pre-need arrangements with a funeral home. At the time of need your family would contact a funeral home who will assist them with making burial arrangements at the national cemetery. To schedule a burial: Fax all discharge documentation to the National Cemetery Scheduling Office at 1-866-900-6417 and follow-up with a phone call to 1-800-535-1117.

Donating Burial Flags in National Cemeteries

Most of the Department of Veterans Affairs national cemeteries display an Avenue of Flags on patriotic holidays and during special events. The Avenues consist of burial flags donated by the families of deceased Veterans and provide a unique visible tribute to all of our Nation's Veterans. A Certificate of Appreciation is presented to the donor for providing their loved ones' burial flag to a national cemetery. Please contact the cemetery of your choice for information on how to donate a veteran's burial flag.

For Burial in a Private Cemetery

Burial benefits available for Veterans buried in a private cemetery include a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag, and a Presidential Memorial Certificate, at no cost to the family. Some Veterans may also be eligible for Burial Allowances. There are not any benefits available to spouses and dependents buried in a private cemetery.

Burial Allowances

VA Burial Allowances are partial reimbursements of an eligible Veteran's burial and funeral costs. When the cause of death is not service related, the reimbursements are generally described as two payments: (1) a burial and funeral expense allowance, and (2) a plot or interment allowance. Certain eligibility requirements must be met (Visit: http://www.vba.va.gov/VBA/benefits/factsheets/burials/Burial.pdf). Generally, the benefits are: Service Related—up to \$2000 toward burial expenses for deaths after 10-1-2011 or up to \$1500 for deaths before 9-31-2011; Non-Service Related— For deaths on or after October 1, 2011, VA will pay up to \$700 toward burial and funeral expenses (if hospitalized by VA at time of death), or \$300 toward burial and funeral expenses (if not hospitalized by VA at time of death), and a \$700.00 plot-interment allowance (if not burled in a national cemetery). For deaths on or after December 1, 2001, but before October 1, 2011, VA will pay up to \$300 toward burial and funeral expenses and a \$300 plot-interment allowance. The plot interment allowance is \$150 for deaths prior to December 1, 2001. If the death happened while the Veteran was in a VA hospital or under VA contracted nursing home care, some or all of the costs for transporting the Veteran's remains may be relmbursed. An annual increase in burial and plot allowances, for deaths occurring after October 1, 2011, begins in fiscal year 2013 based on the Consumer Price Index for the preceding 12-month period.
