Help Wanted !!! Savannah Silent Auction Needs More Donations!

The principle function of the VLOA is to sponsor a reunion every two years to bring together old Outlaws who served together in Viet Nam nearly half a century ago. Every Outlaw reunion planner has tried to keep the costs of their reunion reasonable, to encourage as many attendees as possible to attend.

To maintain a "reasonable" cost, it is not feasible to charge each attendee for all the "incidental" costs of the reunion (signage, hospitality snacks and drinks, recognition awards, printing, badges, welcome bags, favors for attendees, etc. etc.) These items are normally paid for from the VLOA Treasury.

The Treasury has only TWO significant sources of income: Silent Auction donations sold at the reunion and a split of the 50-50 drawing at the reunion. The Nashville reunion Silent Auction offered 75 different items donated by attendees. Sales of these items brought in nearly \$2,900!

Here's the problem! The number of items submitted for this years' Silent Auction is <u>considerably below</u> those of previous years! Time is running short before we will meet in Savannah. Therefore, I am appealing to those who will attend (and also those who cannot attend) to donate at least one item that will bring in some bucks into our Treasury.

The reason for this appeal is simple: The next Outlaw reunion, in 2014, will be the <u>50th Anniversary</u> of our arrival in Vinh Long! That reunion should be an absolutely first-class, memorable experience for everyone who attends. To make it memorable will require significant support from the VLOA Treasury to offset costs that have not normally been included in individual Registration Fees.

One consideration you should keep in mind is that the Vinh Long Outlaws Association is an IRS 501(c)19 tax-exempt, non-profit organization. Donors can deduct contributions made to, or for, the use of the organization by declaring the fair market value of the item. The IRS defines FMV as "the price that property would sell for on the open market which would be agreed on between a willing buyer and a willing seller". For specific guidance on determining the "fair market value" of an item you donate, simply go to IRS.gov, and look up Publication 561. It's easy!

The status of the VLOA treasury will be a major factor in determining the location and affordability of the 50th Anniversary Reunion! The Savannah reunion desperately really needs your support NOW for the Silent Auction. 2014 Will Be GOLDEN For the Outlaws!

1964! Many of us were part of that first group of Outlaws who were quickly pulled out of our CONUS assignments, hurriedly thrown together at Fort Benning, Ft Eustis and other cushy locations, dumped onto old C-118 pistonengine USAF transport planes, shuttled across the Pacific, dropped into Bien Hoa air base and FINALLY transported by C-123s to Vinh Long.

Only a few of us could then say they had been "battle tested" but, soon, we all would be.

We are the fortunate veterans! We survived both the Viet Nam conflict as well as the dark challenges that life threw at so many of our former comrades who are no longer with us. Most of us have completed our life's careers and are comfortably enjoying the fruits that our career provided us. We are blessed, grateful and appreciative.

But, back in late 1964, we did not yet realize that our little Assault Helicopter Company was, in reality, the <u>vanguard unit that spearheaded the massive buildup of US forces</u> that would occur during the next year. By the time we departed CONUS, it was clear that the President and the Pentagon had made the decision to dramatically expand the US commitment in South East Asia. The immediate need was for third Helicopter Company to provide airlift and firepower for the third ARVN Division in the Mekong Delta. And that was us! The rest of the buildup was on its way.

It shouldn't surprise any of us, yet it's still hard to believe, that by the time of our next Outlaw reunion, after Savannah, it will have been <u>50 years</u> since we arrived in Vinh Long. **2014!** Even by that time there will be <u>very few</u> Army units that can say they were in Viet Nam 50 years ago.

The 50th Anniversary reunion should be many things. . enjoyable, convenient, affordable, but most of all MEMORABLE! The reunion should be in a location that has poignancy and meaning to every veteran who ever served in Viet Nam, but especially to the Outlaws! We owe it to ourselves to make the 2014 reunion one that not only WE will remember, but others should be aware, through the press, that HERE is a little helicopter company that was one of the first units deployed to South Viet Nam, and that was 50 years ago. Hardly any other units can make that claim, even in 2014!

We need to begin planning NOW for our 2014 Outlaw reunion The decision as to where to meet for the 2014 50th Anniversary reunion will have to be made during the Savannah reunion. It is vital to get a head start on the massive planning, scheduling and actions necessary to ensure that it is indeed memorable! Moreover, we need to begin making our own personal commitment, now, that we absolutely have to attend that memorable reunion to help make the turnout equally as memorable. We all know it's impossible, especially at our age, We need to begin planning NOW for our 2014 Outlaw reunion We need to begin planning NOW for our 2014 Outlaw reunion to foresee what life will have thrown at us two years down the road, but we can easily begin to make the decision that we really WANT to be a part of a reunion that has been 50 years in the making.

Anders is a very interesting man. I mentioned to him that I retired from the US Army in 1976 and he commented that was the year he was drafted into the Danish Army. He prowls eBay looking for interesting items to add to his collection of US military memorabilia. His collections include a number of Outlaw items as well as a great number of other Army aviation related items from the Viet Nam era.

He has mentioned that he deeply regrets that his father did not know of Anders' future interest in militaria. His father, a resistance fighter in WWII, told him that, as the German Army hurriedly departed Denmark on May 4, 1945, marching back to Germany, they left behind tons of ordnance, uniforms, small arms and other military equipment in the ditches all along the roads in Denmark. Things that Anders would love to have now had in his current collections.

For now, his trip to Savannah has only delayed his plans to go to Viet Nam until later this year. He still plans to visit Vinh Long and hopes to video what might be left of our airfield. He is looking forward to being with the Outlaws in Savannah and will be very interesting to have in our group. I'm sure every Outlaw will welcome him warmly as part of the VLOA.

One thing I told him, after he sent in his money for his Associate Life Member status was that, at 55 years of age, he is far younger than any of us, and, down the road a few years, he could very likely be the <u>last living member of the VLOA!</u>
