My brother changed his name from Norman Henry Goldstein to Josh Gabriel Goldstein. He served with the Outlaws in 67-68.

Josh lived on Oahu, Hawaii for a few years late in life north of Waianae at Makaha Valley Towers. Previously he lived in Berlin Germany for a few years and before that on the California coast at various places between Santa Cruz and LA. He died in August 2018. He's interred at the Punchbowl Military Cemetery in Honolulu.

Josh was married twice and raised a step son and step daughter by his second wife Bonnie. He had a varied career. Early on he got his FAA mechanics license and restored airplanes for the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum. He studied music at Montgomery College in Maryland. Then he moved out west to Santa Cruz and got a degree in Leisure Studies. He studied music recording and became a music producer for a few artists.

In 1981 he had a bad car accident and lost a leg (among other injuries.) This caused him a lot of phantom pain in life. Somewhere in the various surgeries he had, he contracted hepatitis C which eventually caused his death via liver failure. Despite everything he was upbeat and had a positive outlook.
